Christiane Lambert was born in 1961 in Cantal, and both her parents' were also farmers and activists at the JAC (Christian Young Farmer). Lambert chose very early on in her life to work as a farmer, after an agricultural BTS. At 19 years old, she settled on a dairy and pig farm in Cantal.

Lambert was President of the Young Farmers of Massiac (1981-1984) and was also Vice President of the Young farmers in Cantal (1982-1988), she was the first President of Young Farmer of Auvergne in 1986.

Christiane and her husband, Thierry, have three children and are associates in a "GAEC" on a pig farm which has 106 ha of crops (corn, wheat, barley, peas and canola) and 230 sows, with 2 employees in West of France (Maine-et-Loire).

Lambert was the first woman to become President of the National Young Farmers association (CNJA)(1994-1998). Her actions were highlighted by the National Charter for installation, the concept of the multi-functionality of Agriculture and the open minded approach to local and environmental concerns.

Christina was President of the FDSEA of Maine-et-Loire from 2001 to 2011, Secretary General of the FRSEA of Pays de la Loire from 2001 to 2014 and she is member of Bureau of Chamber of Agriculture since 2001.

Lambert has also been the FNSEA's board member since March 2002, and member of the bureau since 2005, she has been Senior Vice President since December 2010. In FNSEA she is Vice-President of the Environment Committee, President of the Food Chain Commission and Head of Sustainable Growth and Society center.

Christiane Lambert was president of FARRE network (Forum for sustainable and environment friendly agriculture) from 1999 to 2005, and she is now President of the training fund, VIVEA, Vice-President of the IFOCAP (Training Institute for Farmer Managers), and AEI Association (Ecologically Intensive Agriculture) based in Angers, France.

As of April 2017, Christiane Lambert became the first woman elected as FNSEA's President.

Christiane Lambert became on 18th September the first female President of Copa, the EU farmers organisation.
